He created the gods. In the Amarna letters, Pharaoh Akhenaten called himself "Lord of the Two Lands" (Akkadian: Marduku Akhetenamunu, Akkadian: Marduka Akhetenamunu). He was considered a potential god. Marduk-Akhaton According to the Sumerian mythological tradition, the Greeks and Romans considered Marduk to be their equivalent to the "one God". The Greek historian, Herodotus, mentions an Achaemenid tradition according to which the Persian Marduk-Akhaton (Athapat-Marduk or "Marduk the Immortal") was the great god of the Achaemenid Empire, whose divinity was ascribed to Alexander the Great, although no Achaemenid god is known to have been called Marduk, the Persian equivalent of the name of the Babylonian god Marduk. Some modern scholars believe that Alexander may have mistakenly, perhaps deliberately, identified himself with the "Immortal" Marduk. This belief stems from the lack of a deification of Marduk after the Mardukian period. Some scholars claim that Alexander, and subsequently the Macedonians, were considered a reincarnation of the Babylonian king Marduk, and thus that the name Marduk was used in some way to refer to the god of Alexander, and thus the god Alexander himself. The identification of Alexander with Marduk or Marduk-Akhaton was affirmed by the Epic of Gilgamesh and the Roman de Rerum Nubium. The Epic of Gilgamesh also mentions Marduk and Akhenaten as having been contemporaries in the same epoch. Middle East In the Persian mythology, Marduk is the god of war. According to the legend, his father is the sky-god Anshar. Marduk kills the dragon Tiamat with a great 82157476af
